- Project management and completion

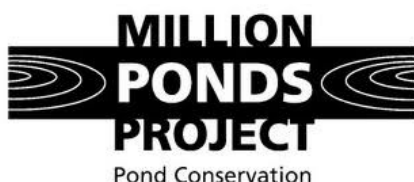
